The CFPC is pleased to be one of eight national health care organizations that have come together to form the Pan-Canadian Collaborative for Improved Opioid Prescribing. This is a partnership that will focus on educational resources for prescribers, with the objective of addressing the harms associated with prescription opioids - including addiction, overdose, and death - while ensuring Canadians have timely and appropriate access to optimal treatment for acute and chronic pain.

On Monday May 8, a new opioid prescribing guideline was released by McMaster's Michael G. DeGroote National Pain Centre. The CFPC will be supporting the dissemination of this new guideline.
