Dear Ms. Casey,

This letter is in support our Canadian Medical Association colleagues on the matter of small business taxes that will affect group medical structures.

We thank you for taking the time to respond to our correspondence. However, we must again raise this issue with you, as we believe there are two important unintended consequences that the federal government should consider.

The first is that this disproportionately affects physicians who are small business owners or managers remunerated under a variety of compensation models determined by their provincial or territorial governments. The result is that the federal government, though not intending to do so, is creating incentives and disincentives for particular compensation models. The

ramifications are unknown but we strongly urge you to study all potential consequences of this action.

The second is that it is possible that some medical practices will close. There is also the potential that some practices will simply not open. We appreciate that this latter point is impossible to

measure, but we are drawing your attention to the possibilities of disincentives to open and operate a practice. The consequence of this would be felt most acutely in resource-constrained communities, and could negatively affect access to care.

While the aim of the small business tax may be fair when broadly applied and we understand that it is aligned with this government's political objectives, we urge you to remove physicians from consideration. As outlined above, the CFPC warns that the unintended consequences could be significant and may affect patient access and create a level of confusion and disorder with respect to compensation models.

The DoctorsNS (DNS) Board of Directors has served Notices of Intended Action to resolve two long-standing contractual issues: government's use of unapproved contracts for Alternative Payment Plan (APP) physicians, and monies owed to DNS for the physicians' health and dental plan and other benefits. We strongly support our DNS colleagues as they pursue this course of action.

In addition to an aging physician workforce, a recent survey conducted of our physicians revealed a high level of burnout from overwork. Add this to the problem of over 100,000 Nova Scotians without a family physician and our concerns are made clear.

At a time when Nova Scotia struggles to retain and recruit physicians it is important to foster a positive environment, and this includes working together to focus on system issues.

We can take the first steps towards resolution by ensuring physicians are treated with respect and fairness, and that we build the foundation for a trusting relationship.

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Suggested Mainpro+ Application Deadlines for Program Approvals

In anticipation of increased application volume prior to the launch of the <u>National Standard for Support of Accredited CPD Activities</u> <u>in January 2018</u>, we strongly recommend that applications for review by the CFPC national office or a CFPC chapter office be

submitted no later than **November 13, 2017** to ensure the best chance of program approval prior to December 31, 2017. Submission by this suggested deadline does not guarantee program approval by December 31, as review results may vary depending on application completeness and adherence to the Mainpro+® certification guidelines.

Please note that National Standard compliance will be required for any program approved on or after January 1, 2018, regardless of when the program was submitted for review. It is also important to note that the College of Family Physicians of Canada is closed from December 21, 2017 to January 1, 2018. CERT+ applications received during the closure period will not be reviewed and approved prior to December 31, 2017.
