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

First developed in Halifax, Nova Scotia, it was spread to nineteen Canadian teams as part of Canadian Foundation for Healthcare Improvement (CFHI) quality improvement 2014-15. Results collaborative in participating health systems show that providing the right services to support Canadians with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) in their homes has improved quality of life for patients, while also dramatically reducing hospital readmissions by 64% and emergency department visits by 52%.
